

CAMDEN NEWS NOTES

** At the reorganization of the Republican County Executive Committee yesterday, Chairman Harry Reeves and Secretary William D. Brown were re-elected.

** The Firemen's Mutual Benevolent Association has elected these officers: President, Lewis Buzine; first vice president, Wright Cox; second vice president, Seth Monnell; treasurer, William Elberson; recording secretary, William Miller; financial secretary, William Rose.

** Benjamin Richmond received a decree from Chancellor Magie yesterday in which Richmond is granted a divorce from his wife.

** Fillage Ollizo, of North Thirty-seventh street, East Camden, may suffer the loss of part of his right hand as the result of an accident at the Pavonia Car Shops yesterday. A large casting fell on the hand, crushing a portion of it to a pulp.
