** City Clerk Kramer yesterday issued a permit to the Standard Oil Company for the erection of a brick building 20x28 feet, to be located on River road

** The Gottlieb Baumschmidt-Strauss Brewing Company was incorporated yesterday with a capital of \$3,000,000.

** William B Hatch Post, 37, G. A. R., opened its annual camp at Wood Lynne Park yesterday with a flag raising and the firing of salutes.

** Morris Murphy was given ten days by the Recorder yesterday for creating a disturbance on a trolley car.

** Walter Hickman, the young man in the Camden jail charged with stealing an \$800 launch from Robert Parvin, was thought to be drowned. After Hickman disappeared the launch was found partially submerged and it was concluded Hickman had met death by drowning. The harbor police had been hunting his body. He will be given a hearing to-day.
