

MOTHER DECLARED NOTE WAS FORGERY

Camden Jury Rendered Verdict
Against Son and Prosecutor at
Once Began Criminal Action

Forging, it is alleged, the name of his mother to several promissory notes not only resulted in a jury before Circuit Court Judge Endicott, in Camden giving a verdict for \$405 against William Schwab in favor of Samuel Paul, but also caused Prosecutor Scovel to take criminal action against him. When the jury gave its verdict a recommendation was made that Schwab be held responsible for his alleged act of forgery and upon information received County Detective John Cherry entered complaint before Justice Barr against the defendant.

On the witness stand Mrs. Schwab and her three sons declared that the signature appended to the promissory notes and imputed to be that of the woman was a forgery. The son William, who borrowed several hundred dollars from Paul, gave the latter the note.
