\*\* Grasping a live electric wire and falling twenty feet from a pole, James Welch, 24 years old, of 617 Cedar street, Camden, escaped death in two forms yesterday. He was taken to the Cooper Hospital, where it was found that he had been bruised and badly shocked.

\*\* Following a search of several weeks Jesse Deputy, of Milford, Del., yesterday located his wife and two daughters, who are alleged to have fled with Clarence B. Willey, of the same Delaware town. They were found living at 1895 Cooper street, Camden, and Deputy at once entered a charge against Willey and also against the woman before Justice Reeyes. Both were committed to the county jail in default of bail.
