

FRANK DORIS HELD IN VILLANO MURDER

Detained Without Bail to Await Action of Coroner on Friday

Charged with being implicated in the shooting of Frank Villano, a fruit merchant, who died from wounds he received in the apartments of Margaret Sailer, at Tenth and Walnut streets last Wednesday, Frank Doris, 19 years old, of 307 North Marshall street, yesterday was held without bail by Magistrate Renshaw to await the action of the coroner. Miss Sailer was not present at the hearing.

Doris was sought by detectives for two days following the shooting, and finally surrendered after his friends had raised a defense fund of \$2500.

As the defense decided to waive a hearing, but one witness testified at the magistrate's hearing. He was Detective Peter Sheller, of the murder squad, who attempted to obtain an ante-mortem statement from the wounded man, but failed. The detective testified that physicians had told him Villano was in no serious danger, but Villano died before the statement could be obtained.

It is believed Doris will be arraigned before Coroner Knight on Friday when an inquest will be held. Margaret Sailer who is being held in Morals Court, at Twelfth and Wood streets, also will be produced then as a witness.
