

# WHITE ARRIVES, BUT FINDS NO GYM OPEN

Hence Charley Is Forced to  
Put Finishing Touches for  
Barrett in His Hotel Room

**R**EADY for his second battle with Bobby Barrett, the Clifton red-head, Charley White, a boxer for seventeen years, arrived yesterday from his home in Chicago, and bemoaned the fact, that the rigid Sabbath laws here did not permit him to get in his regular training.

"I walked all over this burg," he said last night, "trying to find a gymnasium. After I went everywhere and found nothing, I had to go back to my hotel room and work out de luxe."

White says he is in splendid shape and is anxious to get a chance to battle Benny Leonard for the lightweight title. He asked if Barrett was in good shape, and when informed that Bobby reported 100 per cent, he said with a smile

"He better be. He's a tough fellow at that to fight."

The second feud between the Chicagoan and the freckled battler of Delaware county will be staged as the wind-up at the Olympia A. A. tonight, and a capacity house will probably be on hand to watch the boxers mingle again.

The last time they met in mutual assault and battery was in New York, and Bobby kissed the rosin in the third round, after it looked as if he were mauling Charles all over the arena.

Four eight-round contests will precede the White-Barrett tilt. In the semi-final, Johnny Brown, of England, will meet Frankie Conway, of Camden. The pairings for the other contests are: Eddie Dempsey vs. Sammy Brne, Bobby Robideau vs. Sammy Hewitt and Al Gordon vs. Jack Lester.
