

DEATH BY SHOOTING IN PHILADELPHIA

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., August 4, 1873.

Samuel M. Williamson, a resident of Wilmington, Del., was accidentally shot in a pawnshop, at the corner of Third and South streets, this evening. He was examining a gun, and a colored man named Dempsey Butler was looking at a pistol, when the latter was accidentally discharged. The ball entered the left side of Williamson, passing downwards. He was removed to the hospital in a dangerous condition.
