

OVER IN CAMDEN.

* Edward Weston and Edward Hartman have been given positions in the Fire Department.

* Edward Fogarty, who stabbed Thomas Lyons at Gloucester Friday, was committed to the county jail by Mayor Jackson yesterday.

* Edward Roseville, while drunk, assaulted Justice Chester and drove his team over 7-year-old Lillie Morgan, of 645 Vanhook street, breaking her collar-bone. The justice sent him to jail.

* William Chase, 39 years old, of 1026 South Sixth street, was struck over the eye with a base ball bat during a fight in a down-town saloon last night, and had to be taken to the Cooper Hospital.

* Eugene Lippincott, the organist charged with taking improper liberties with the six-year-old daughter of George W. Ingraham, of Third and Berkley streets, was held in \$1,500 bail by Mayor Pratt yesterday.

* Travel to the shore yesterday was the heaviest of the season. The Atlantic City Railroad took 103 carloads of people to Atlantic City, and the West Jersey and Camden and Atlantic Roads 188 cars. Seventy cars were run to Cape May and Ocean City.

* Wilmington detectives were in Camden Friday looking up a gang of sixteen burglars and pickpockets who had lately infested that city. They identified Joseph Murphy confined in the county jail for breaking into James Moore's boat houses as one of the gang.

* Louis Holler, publisher of the *Camden County Journal* (German) threatens to invalidate the sales of property under legal proceedings in Camden county, when the sales were not advertised in his paper. The last legislature passed a law requiring all such sales to be published in a German paper, but the Camden lawyers have ignored the law.
