ONE, DERAILED, HITS OTHER

Motorman Sustains Broken Arm and
Dislocated Shoulder—Injured Were
From Philadelphia and Camden.

CAMDEN, N. J., July 4.—Twelve persons were injured here this afternoon when two trolley cars loaded with a holiday crowd returning to their homes crashed at State Street and River Avenue. The accident happened when in turning a curve one of the cars jumped the tracks and smashed into the other one. The injured taken to Cooper Hospital were:

SANBURG, JOSEPHINE, 56 years old, of 478 North Fifth Street, Philadelphia; lacerations of the scalp.

KENT, LILLIAN, 24 years old, of 1,211 East Oxford Street, Philadelphia; right ankle broken.

WUERTZ, FRANK, 43 years old, of 211 Mechanic Street, Camden; lacerations of head.
