\*\* Policeman John Beard was overcome by the heat yesterday afternoon on Cooper street. He was removed to his home, at 121 Pearl street.

\*\* James Carroll, manager of the Fries-Breslin Rug Company, said yesterday the strike, which has been in progress since May 20, is over. Many of the strikers, however, are still out.

\*\* George Harris, the alleged proprietor of the place at 912 South Third street, which was raided early Sunday morning, was held in ball for court by the Recorder yesterday. The seventeen other prisoners captured in the raid were fined.

\*\* Joseph Dutch, alias Bradley, who was arrested at the Pennsylvania Railroad terminal Saturday by County Detective Smith on suspicion of being a pickpocket, was yesterday committed to prison by the Recorder in default of \$300 bail.

\*\* Vice Chancellor Grev yesterday postponed action on the application for a rule to show cause why an injunction should not issue to prevent the striking glass blowers from interfering with the non-union glass blowers at Minatola, until September 10.

\*\* Judge Joline yesterday dismissed the petition of Judge Bergen in the assigned estate of Browning Brothers, in which he asked that the orders in the case be expunged from the records of the New Jersey courts. H. B. Hanford, the assignee, was ordered to hold the \$80,000.
