

NEGRESS BURNED TO DEATH

Invalid Sister Rescued After Giving Alarm

Mrs. Mary Ann Waters, a negress, 59 years old, of 917 Chestnut street, Camden, was burned to death yesterday, when the kitchen of her home became ignited, supposedly from an overheated stove. The woman was trapped in the room and her charred body was found alongside the cellar door after the firemen had extinguished the blaze. Mrs. Lizzie Morris, her sister and an invalid, who was up-stairs, was rescued by Fireman Harry Chambers and Perry Daniels, a neighbor.

Mrs. Waters had left her sister to prepare breakfast and it was shortly after she was heard to scream and smoke that came up the stairway showed Mrs. Morris what had happened. She crawled to a window, broke it, called for help and then sank to the floor unconscious, where she was found. The fire caused a loss of several hundred dollars. Coroner Bushey viewed the body of the fire victim and gave a certificate in accordance with the facts.

Retired Fireman Hurt in Fall
