

OVER IN CAMDEN

*The Crescent Wheelmen filed articles of incorporation in the County Clerk's office yesterday.

*John Roosevelt, of 1734 Van Buren street, reported to the police yesterday that his horse and wagon had been stolen.

*Mary E. Finley, 17 years old, 320 Vine street, who was operated upon in a Philadelphia hospital last Friday for appendicitis, is dead.

*Step Sorrell, colored, is locked up at the Camden City Hall awaiting requisition papers from Philadelphia on a charge of assault and battery.

*Edward Kinn, of 447 Berkley street, was injured at a saw mill at Front and Arch streets yesterday by a heavy plank falling on him. He was taken home.

*The government's offer of \$4500 for the Logan property, adjoining the new post-office site, has been refused and condemnation proceedings will probably be instituted.

*Margaret McDonnell, a junk dealer, of Second and Stevens streets, was held in \$500 bail by Mayor Westcott yesterday charged with receiving stolen goods. A warrant has also been issued for her husband.
