** Eighth ward Republicans have organized a club in the interests of Dr. Grant E. Kirk for Councils and William Mills for freeholder. Lewis Smeerer is president and there are 250 names on the membership list.

** Thrown to the ground when his dog vigorously tugged on the chain with which he was leading the animal, Assistant Tax Receiver Charles Elfreth sustained a sprained ankle.
