

## CAMDEN NEWS NOTES

R. C. Wardlow yesterday withdrew his application for a liquor license at Lindenwold.

After suffering three days, 14-year-old Lewis Haslins, colored, of 2003 South Ninth street, died in Cooper Hospital from tetanus, which developed in a wound in the foot caused by stepping on the fork of a rake.

Although unable to walk and still in a serious condition, Robert Wilson, who was shot on March 14 by Charles Ford, yesterday was moved from Cooper Hospital to his home at Laurel Springs. After shooting Wilson Ford murdered Mrs. May Wagner and shot himself. He is in the county jail awaiting trial.

For Licking Policeman Ellis after he had been arrested for fighting, Benjamin Korvicki was yesterday sentenced by Recorder Stackhouse to sixty days in the county jail.

Taking the ground that a saloon at Batesville, Camden county, would be a menace to the welfare of their community, Haddonfield residents yesterday crowded the Camden License Court in protest against the granting of a license to David Bodine to sell liquor at what is known as the "Blazing Rag" Hotel. Their efforts were crowned with success. Judge Carrow announced his intention to refuse the license.

Found guilty of a charge of attempted assault preferred by Mrs. Laura Price, Harry Pine, of Camden, was yesterday sentenced by Judge Carrow to not more than three years and not less than one year in the State prison. Mrs. Price told the court that Pine, after volunteering to direct her to a section of the city with which she was not familiar, led her to a secluded spot, knocked her down and tried to assault her.
