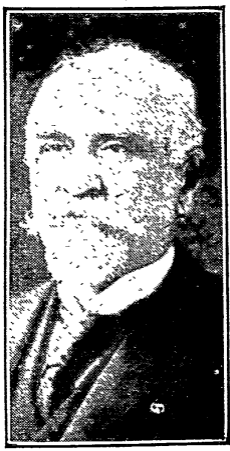


# SHERIFF HATCH NAMES CAMDEN'S GRAND JURY
