

Arrest Stirs Religious Circles

Religious and railroad circles in Camden were shocked yesterday when Samuel L. Jones, a Pennsylvania Railroad official and church worker, was taken before Justice Huyett to answer a charge made against him by Morris Odell, Assistant City Clerk of Camden. May 15 last is the date given as the time of the alleged transgression of the law. Mr. Odell stated to the court that he based his charge on what he observed when he and two others made their way into an apartment in a house on Cooper street. The name of the woman said to be involved does not appear in the complaint. Mr. Jones waived a hearing and gave bail in the sum of \$500 to await the action of the grand jury. Mr. Jones last night issued a statement in which he asserts his innocence.
