Items of Interest in Camden County and Vicinity.

Colonel I. B. Buckelow, superintendent of the Ansbay division of the Pennsylvania, is lying seriously ill of typhoid fever at his residence, No. 101 Linden street, Camden.

The third annual meeting of the Camden County Board of Agriculturists will be held in the Microscopical Society's Hall, Third street, below Market, on next Tuesday.

In the Camden county courts before Judges Reed, Woolston and Grant, William Campbell, convicted of assault and battery on Gabriel Hill, was sentenced to pay a fine of \$1 00 and costs of prosecution, or to stand committed to the county jail for thirty days. Zachariah Taylor, convicted of assault and battery, received a similar sentence. George, alias "Stohrs" Cattel, of Gloucester City, convicted of assault and battery on an officer, was sentenced to pay a fine of \$75, to be incarcerated a week. If said fine be not paid then he was to receive a sentence of nine months in State Prison.

The case against Abraham Workman, John Traig, Ephraim Farr, Frederick Abels, Samuel Haughey, Louis Atkinson, Samuel C. Smith, Arthur Johnson Edward Haughey, Albert Watson and Samuel Wilmot for assault and battery upon officer Southard was abandoned for want of evidence.

In the Camden District Court yesterday, Judge Woodruff, of Frenton, presiding, the case of Alexander Bell vs Patrick Kenah, a suit to recover \$1 17, was decided in favor of the plaintiff.

William Blair and his wife, Jane, have been held in \$200 bail each for trial at court by Justice Schmitz on the charge of brutally beating John Winters.

Mrs. E. W. Pambes, of Absecon, a passenger on the 4:30 P. M. accommodation train on the Camden and Atlantic Railroad, on Thursday was robbed of dry goods valued at thirty dollars as the train was leaving the station at Waterford, Camden county.

Clarence M. Seovel, counsel for Howell H. Price, the colored justice of the peace of the eighth ward, who was recently fined for malfeasance in office, takes exception to the reports circulated about his clients being absent when wanted, and to an officer arresting him on a bench warrant. Seovel says Rev. Bishop Price had a call to a church in North Carolina, and was there preaching when called for trial.

Joseph Wagner, arrested on a bench warrant on Thursday evening, charged with having committed perjury, was admitted to bail yesterday in the sum of \$500.

The members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of Camden county have at last realized that the citizens disapprove of their singular actions at the last meeting in electing Danbman wardens. Everyone, irrespective of party condemned the act, and even the members themselves are anxious to get out of the dilemma. A call has been issued, signed by Messrs Tomlinson, Mackara and Mitchell, "for the holding of a meeting, on Monday, December 1, for the purpose of removing Jacob C. Danbman from the office of keeper of the jail, and to transact such other business as may come up."
