

CHARGE, MURDER TO ITALIAN NOW ON SEA

Camden Police Believe Man Sailing
for His Home Killed, William
Gallagher

Sailing on the high seas to what he presumably thinks is safety in his native province of Italy, Ilario Di Antonio, alleged to be the murderer of William Gallagher, who was stabbed to death in Camden a couple of weeks ago, is being awaited by the authorities, who will place him under arrest as soon as he lands. Chief of Police Gravenor, of Camden, yesterday communicated with Italian Consul Felece Ronce at Trenton, and word was at once forwarded to the Province Di Acoli, Italy, Di Antonio's home.

With virtually nothing upon which to work, the case was assigned Detectives Schregler and Troncone. Gallagher was stabbed to death early Sunday morning of December 8 at Locust and Pine streets. He was found bleeding to death and succumbed to his injuries shortly after being admitted to the Cooper Hospital. Through Troncone, who is the Italian detective in Camden, it was learned that Giuseppe Azzari, of 204 Beckett street, knew something about the crime. He was placed under arrest yesterday, and as a result Antonio Da Andea, of 325 Locust street, was also apprehended. They both broke down and told the facts in the tragedy.

According to their stories, the alleged slayer of Gallagher took exception to an insulting remark Gallagher had made concerning a woman. Words followed and then the stabbing. Di Antonio, according to his compatriots, stabbing Gallagher through the heart with a stiletto. As soon as possible Di Antonio took ship for his home.

The alleged murderer lived in an Italian tenement house at Third and Line streets, next to the place where Agostine Toscone was stabbed to death by Giuseppe Diane on October 1. The latter is a fugitive.
